

## Strengthening Endings with V<sup>7</sup>

## **Part I.** Resolving V<sup>7</sup>.

- Add the correct key signature to each excerpt, then
- Part-write each resolution of  $V^7$  in four-part **vocal style** following the directions above each excerpt.
- Draw lines to show the correct resolution of the leading tone and chordal 7<sup>th</sup>





## Part III. Analysis.

- Two excerpts appear on the following pages. For each:
  - o Label the key of the excerpt underneath the key signature at the beginning of the staff
  - o Label all cadences in the excerpt.
    - Note: the ends of the excerpts here do not end with cadences; it's important to listen to excerpt and mark where you hear endings occurring
  - o Provide a Roman numeral analysis of any cadence point that ends V<sup>7</sup>-I in major or V<sup>7</sup>-i in minor.
