

Editing with Adjective Clauses ANSWERS

Combine the two sentences into one, keeping the bolded sentence as the independent clause. Create an adjective clause out of the second sentence in each pair.

STEPS:

1. Find the pronoun in sentence #2 and match it to a noun in sentence #1.
2. Change the pronoun in sentence #2 to a marker word.
3. Move sentence #2 next to the noun it describes in sentence #1.

1. The bread is delicious. I baked it.

The bread which/that I baked is delicious.

2. My boss was very angry today. He is usually very calm.

My boss, who is usually very calm, was very angry today.

3. Rose read a book. The book was very difficult but very interesting.

Rose read a book that/which was very difficult but very interesting.

4. I found a wallet. It was lying on the sidewalk.

I found a wallet that/which was lying on the sidewalk.

5. The woman was very sad. Her cat had run away.

The woman whose cat had run away was very sad.

6. The teacher will speak to the parents. Their daughter is failing the class.

The teacher will speak to the parents whose daughter is failing the class.
